Brexit: Solder Connection Company Statement

Dear Customer,

On March 29th 2017, the UK declared its intention to withdraw from the EU, a process which has become known as Brexit. Since that result and with renewed vigor and focus following the government's announcement in 2017, Solder Connection has worked carefully to examine the various implications of this process and has taken a number of important steps to ensure that our business continuity planning remains robust and relevant in the face of the undoubted challenges which our exit from the Union will bring.

We looked carefully at the following vital business elements in the context of the various exit scenarios;

- Customer service and supply chain
- Storage and logistics in the UK and in the EU
- Costs, financial performance and the potential impact of tariffs
- Potential additional administrative burden
